





Youth Lesson Sponsorship Program



Back for 2025!

This program is for any WRHA youth who feel that they would benefit from individual lessons with a professional trainer.

Eligibility:

Open to all youth who have actively shown with WRHA in the past 1 or 2 years (2023 and/or 2024) and have a current 2025 WRHA membership.

How It Works:


Youth are asked to go and obtain sponsorship money, which WRHA will match dollar-for-dollar up to \$150. Example: If \$150 in sponsorships is obtained, WRHA will add \$150, so a total of \$300 is available. Money is to be used for lessons provided by one of the participating trainers listed on the Youth Sponsorship Program form.

This program is available to the first 15 youth who submit their completed sponsorship forms.

WRHA General Membership Meeting August 8, 2025

Call to order

 A meeting of the Wisconsin Ranch Horse Association was held at the Walworth County Fairgrounds, Elkhorn, WI at 7:16 pm on August 8, 2025.

Attendees

 Officers and board members in attendance: Jo Ellen Milkie, Natalie Derry, Sarah Lidicker, Ashley Gorczynski, Gerald Milkie.

Discussions

- 1. Treasurer's Report (presented by Sarah Lidicker)
 - Current financial report was distributed and discussed.
 - During the reporting period of 1/1/2025 to 7/31/2025, total income was \$136,690.91,
 and total expenses were \$97,219.19, resulting in a net surplus of \$39,471.72.
 - We are looking for ideas on how best to use the income to benefit the charter.
- Secretary's Report (presented by Ashley Gorczynski)
 - Memberships
 - As of 8/6/2025, we have a total of 240 memberships (185 single, 33 family, 21 youth, 1 lifetime).
 - We've seen great growth this year. 68 new memberships for 2025.
 - For 2025, we offered option of receiving membership card by email instead of by USPS mail. 162 memberships have been sent via email this year, resulting in a cost savings of \$126.36 in postage fees and many labor hours saved.

Sponsorships

- Action item from the 2024 membership meeting was to gain more sponsors.
 As of 8/6/2025, we have 28 total sponsors for the year.
- We've had a positive response to our increased focus on sponsor entitlements/benefits.
- Suggestion to offer advertising space on arena drag as a sponsor benefit.

Media and Communications

- More traffic on the WRHA website this year. Through 7/31, 31% increase in unique visits and 39% increase in page views, when compared to all of 2024.
- Brought back quarterly newsletters for 2025.

Cognito Forms

 Action item from 2024 membership meeting was to integrate at-will sign-up into pre-entry forms. We upgraded our account plan to allow for at-will signups and online payment integration.

Year-End Points

- Action item from 2024 meeting was to have points updated and posted after every show. 2025 points are actively being updated after each show for class standings, division high point, top performance horse, and top cow horse.
- Reminder to members to check your points after every show, not at the end of the season.

3. Old Business

Bylaws

Updated March 16, 2025 and available on the WRHA website.

Apparel

- Positive feedback on WRHA apparel offerings for 2025. Planning to re-open online store in September.
- Would like to have the youth design a logo and offer it on apparel in addition to the regular WRHA design for 2026.

Pattern Books

- New for 2025. Sold at shows starting in May. Sold 69 books so far.
- Would like to continue for 2026 and have them for sale at awards banquet.

Show Staff

- Watson Horse Shows running show office for 2025.
- Currently working on proposals and contracts for show staff for 2026.
- Considering the rate that our charter is growing, we plan to hire more staff for 2026, including a show manager.

Volunteers (Ringside Support Committee)

- Action item from 2024 membership meeting was to improve volunteer communications and provide incentives.
- New committee for 2025. Advertised on fb page & group, website, & in quarterly newsletter.
- Online sign-up form available on website.

2 Year-Old Challenge

- New for 2025. 4 horses entered this year.
- Discussed if there was interest in continuing program for 2026. If yes, we need support from sponsors for prizes, added money, etc.
- Suggestion to have a separate side-pot from breeders.

4. New Business

2025 Shows & Statistics

PAGE 17

- May show: 959 entries (largest WRHA show ever!)
- June show: 828 entries (larger than 3 out of 4 WRHA shows from 2024)

Youth Regional/World Team

- We would like the WRHA Youth to form a team for any regional or world show in 2026. WRHA to pay for shirts, stalls, and (maybe) help with entries.
- Comment that the world show is far and expensive would any youth be interested? Can take a poll when the time comes.
- Currently have over \$7000 in youth account.

Best Practices for Pre-Entries & Reservations

- Butch Watson presented some ways that exhibitors can help the show office run more efficiently – he also discussed some process improvements that are currently being worked on.
 - When filling out group stall reservations, use the person's full name and the horse's ARHA-registered name to ensure that the reservations are assigned to the correct parties.
 - If you would like to stall with someone, the request must be entered on the reservation form.
 - For stalling or barn requests, the earlier you can submit your reservation, the better! The show office cannot guarantee any late requests due to the volume of stall reservations.
 - For the August show, tablets are being testing for communicating results to the show office.
 - For results/score sheets at the show, additional binders have been added to separate results/score sheets by arena (cattle, at-will).
 - To improve accuracy and turnaround of processing results, a 3rd person will be working in the show office to check score sheets.

2026 Board of Directors

- The WRHA board will have turnover for 2026, specifically the positions of President and Treasurer.
- Sarah Lidicker is leaving detailed instructions on how to handle everything in the Treasurer position.
- Officer nominations will open after the September show and will close on November 30. Will have an online form for nominations as in past years.
- Any officer that is on the board is open to background checks.
- We are looking for WRHA members to step-up and represent their charter. If you plan on nominating someone, please ensure that you talk to the person you are nominating to make sure they are willing to run.

Camping

Since we are sharing the grounds with another show in August, camping spots are at a premium, and spots filled up quicker than usual. Since Barn E is being used by the other show, WRHA is unable to use the camping spots by Barn E, but overflow camping is available on the other side of the fence near Barn E.

- Reminder that the official move-in time is after 12pm on Friday, and camping sites for first come, first served. Please do not arrive before that time unless you have approval from WRHA to do so.
- Suggestion to offer early arrival and/or reserved camping spots as a volunteer incentive.
- Suggestion to ask Walworth County Fairgrounds to paint lines on ground for camping spots.

o 2026 Shows

- 2026 tentative dates: May 15-17, June 26-28, Aug 15-17, Sept 25-27
- Planning to have 3-day shows for 2026. Would like to start Friday classes in the afternoon (~2 or 3pm).
- Would like to run 1 arena on Friday, 2 arenas on Saturday, and 1 arena on Sunday.

Schedule Suggestions & Comments

- Discussed whether or not we should keep Cutting on the showbill. Mixed response from membership. It would be nice to keep Cutting because it is "ranchy," but most ARHA charters do not offer it. In 2024, the only ARHA shows that offered Cutting were WRHA, ILRHA, SERHS (Open & Am only), and the World Show (Open & Am only).
- Discussed if there was interest bringing back the Novice Youth division. It was dropped from the schedule several years ago due to low participation.
- Discussed if there was interest in splitting more All Age classes into Jr. and Sr. The only other All Age classes that we can potentially split are Ranchmanship, Reining, Ranch Reining, Ranch Cutting, and Herd Work
- Suggestion to not have any Youth classes on Friday.
- Our current show schedule is very busy, and we would like to have a show schedule that would allow time for us to have special events again (potlucks, dog races, freestyle reining/ranchmanship, calcuttas, etc.).

o 2026-2027 ARHA Rule Change Proposals

The ARHA rule change meeting is scheduled for August 26th. WRHA will have 2 board members attending and voting on the charter's behalf. The proposed rule changes were read and discussed.

Adjournment

Meeting was adjourned at 8:52 pm.

ARHA Rulebook

- 1) WRHA membership is **required** for all horse owners & exhibitors to exhibit at any WRHA show.
- 2) ARHA membership is **required** for all horse owners & exhibitors showing in ARHA-sanctioned classes. ARHA certificate of eligibility is **required** for horses showing in ARHA-sanctioned classes. Must provide copy at time of entry. Note: Green As Grass (GAG), Green Horse (GH), Walk/Trot, and 10 & under classes are exempt from ARHA requirements.
- 3) ARHA registry is open to all western-type breeds. You may join ARHA, register, & show your horse the same day (bring copies of front & back of breed registry papers). Applicable ARHA fees will apply, including a \$10 rush fee for each membership. Refer to the ARHA Rule Book for more information.
- 4) Current negative EIA (Coggins) is required for all horses. Copy to be provided to show office. If the Coggins lists a current home premises of equine outside of Wisconsin, then the horse is considered an "out of state horse." All out of state horses MUST show a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI), dated within 30 days of the show, at show office. This is required by ATCP 10.36.
- 5) All classes are judged according to ARHA rules. Refer to the ARHA rulebook for more information. Judge's decision is final.
- 6) Exhibitors must show in traditional western attire in all classes, including boots, long-sleeved shirt, hat/helmet, & jeans. Refer to the ARHA Rule Book for more information.
- 7) No fake tails, banded manes, or hoof polish allowed. Judged on natural appearance & movement. Refer to the ARHA Rule Book for more information.
- 8) All youth classes are 18 & under as of January 1, 2025.
- 9) Walk Trot Restricted: No ARHA points awarded. Horse/exhibitor combination cannot enter any canter classes.
- 10) **Green As Grass (GAG)**: No ARHA points awarded. These classes are for Amateur & Youth in their 1st, 2nd, & 3rd calendar year of showing in ANY club or association. All horses must be ridden in legal ARHA tack (no training equipment). Horses may be ridden one or two-handed. Exhibitors are no longer eligible for GAG if they have won a Year End High Point or Reserve High Point in GAG or any other division.
- 11) **Green Horse (GH):** No ARHA points awarded. The purpose of these classes is to give horses new to the show world an opportunity to compete against horses of similar experience levels. Eligible to horses of any age in their 1st calendar year of being shown under saddle in walk/trot/lope classes. Horses that have previously shown inhand or in walk-trot classes are eligible. Open to Youth, Amateur, or Open riders. All horses must be ridden in legal ARHA tack (no training equipment). Horses may be ridden one or two-handed. May cross-enter into other appropriate divisions. Horses are no longer eligible for Green Horse after they have shown WRHA walk/trot/lope classes for 1 show year.
- 12) Camping is available on the show grounds. Show grounds may be shared with other associations. Specific camping spots WILL be assigned to board members & show staff. If you park/camp in a spot assigned to someone else, you **will** be required to move. Please check with show office or a WRHA board member prior to parking your camping vehicle.
- 13) WRHA offers an Awards Program, including Weekend & Year-End awards. Please refer to the WRHA Awards Program document on the WRHA website for more information.

General Rules

- Horse owners & exhibitors must all be current WRHA members in good standing to be eligible for any awards (weekend or year-end). Points will not count toward weekend or year-end awards until WRHA membership dues have been paid.
- Points for All Age division accumulate on the horse. Points for all other divisions accumulate on the horse/exhibitor combination.
- WRHA points follow the ARHA point scale for all awards. See Section H-13 of ARHA rulebook.

Weekend High Point

 Awards given to 1st & 2nd highest point-earners in each division. Exhibitors MUST show in a cattle class in that division to be eligible. Divisions include All Age, Amateur, Novice Amateur, Youth, & Green As Grass.

Year-End Class Awards

- Awards given to 1st, 2nd & 3rd highest point-earners in each class. Must earn at least one (1) point in the class to receive the award. Must show in the class at a minimum of three (3) of the four (4) WRHA shows to qualify.
- Points will be awarded based on class placings. For Conformation classes, points earned in Grand & Reserve will also be included (Grand receives 2 points, Reserve receives 1 point).

Year-End Division High Point Awards

 Awards given to 1st, 2nd & 3rd highest point-earners in each division. MUST show in a cattle class at three (3) of the four (4) WRHA shows in that division to be eligible. Divisions include All Age, Amateur, Novice Amateur, Youth, & Green As Grass.

Year-End Top Cow Horse Award (TCH)

 Awards given in All Age & Amateur divisions to the 1st & 2nd highest point-earners in all cattle classes in those divisions. Classes include Cutting, Herd Work, Boxing, Ranch Roping, Working Ranch Horse, & Ranch Cutting. Must show at three (3) of the four (4) WRHA shows in that division to be eligible.

Year-End Top Performance Horse Award (TPH)

Awards given in All Age & Amateur divisions to the 1st & 2nd highest point-earners in all non-cattle classes. Classes include Horsemanship, Trail, Reining, Conformation, Showmanship, Ranch Riding, Ranchmanship, & Ranch Reining. Must show at three (3) of the four (4) WRHA shows in that division to be eligible.

For all Year End Awards...

 In the case of a tie, ties will be broken by the following order: the highest number of points earned in those classes under Judge A at the four (4) WRHA shows, most number of 1st places, most number of 2nd places, etc.



Youth Sponsorship Program

OBJECTIVE OF PROGRAM: This program is for any youth that feel they would benefit from individual lessons with a professional trainer. We are asking youth to show their dedication and desire to be a part of this program by going out and raising money for lessons through sponsorships.

ELIGIBILITY: This program is open to all youth who have actively shown with WRHA in the past one or two years (either 2023 and/or 2024) and have a current 2025 WRHA membership.

HOW IT WORKS: Youth are asked to go out and obtain sponsorship money which WRHA will match dollar-for-dollar up to \$150. Example: If you obtain \$150 in sponsorships, WRHA will add \$150, so a total of \$300 is available. Money is to be used for lessons provided by one of the participating trainers on our list. Sponsorship money can be solicited from businesses, friends, family, etc. and is to be paid directly to WRHA. This program is available to the first 15 youth who submit their sponsorship forms.

The youth member will be responsible for their own transportation and setting up dates/times for lessons directly with the trainer. List of dates/times of lessons to be provided to WRHA who will then coordinate payment direct to the trainer. All lessons must be completed by November 1, 2025.

PARTICIPATING TRAINERS: A list of participating trainers is attached. Trainers on this list are well-versed in ranch shows/classes and have committed to the rules of this program; some are ARHA judges. We have tried to provide a variety of locations in Wisconsin and northern Illinois to accommodate as many youth as possible.
